






























# The Slimeball Speaks

This issue: Someone DIES.

The **Asbestos Mushroom** has been here pretty much from the beginning (see Behind The Story below), and it's a bit sad to have him ride off into the sunset this issue. Still, even if this is his final appearance in *Amoeba Adventures*, at least he goes out with a fittingly fungi bit of flair!

I started drawing this issue in a strange place - a New Zealand government Managed Isolation Quarantine hotel in Christchurch, where I had to stay for 10 days alone in late January after returning home from my first trip back to America in two years. While I got occasionally poked and prodded and tested for Covid-19 (all negative, praise be), I sketched out the first third or so of this issue and mapped out the rest. When you're alone in a hotel room, what better use of your time than drawing comics, really?

The tumult of the last year or two - not just global, but also on a personal scale in many ways - probably leaked into the writing of this issue a bit again. The last couple of years have certainly made all of our lives seem a little more fragile. I wondered what makes a person, and what shapes who they're perceived to be. As the story you've (hopefully) just read shows, there's no easy answer to that question.

### **Behind the story**

Who doesn't love a villain? The bizarre villains of the *Amoeba Adventures* world have always been some of my favourite characters, from the bumbling Herr Heinous to the genuinely scary Dark One.

The Asbestos Mushroom has always been my favourite Amoeba villain to write, and perhaps the strangest. He first appeared way, way back in the *Amoeba Adventures* precursor 1986's *Prometheus* #2, which I wrote and drew in between boring lectures in high school classes.

His name came from some sort of twisted homage to / parody of Bob Burden's fantastic surreal independent comics character, the Flaming Carrot, who I was hugely inspired by in creating my own 'toons.

(It's hard to say years and years later, but I guess I thought if there's a Flaming Carrot, there must be an Asbestos Mushroom out there somewhere in the multiverse to counterbalance him?)

The raving, looney evil Mushroom was a regular nemesis to Prometheus and friends all through the 1990-1998 run of *Amoeba Adventures*, popping up in #5 to



attack them on the David Letterman show (!) and to attack them again in #18-19 with a bunch of miniature mushroombots and a convoluted plot involving action figures stuffed with heroin (!!).

He was always colorfully one-note and great fun to write rage-filled monologues for, and it seemed appropriate to bring him back for one last hurrah in the "new" Amoeba Adventures, and maybe, just this once, dig a little deeper into who he was and what made him tick. Vale, Asbestos Mushroom - you might've been a bad guy, but you were good fun to write and draw.

Oh, and for the perverse reader who always asks - no, he wasn't designed intentionally as a phallic symbol. He's a mushroom, darn it. They just look that way.


There's a few other deep-dives among the villains in this issue. Herr Heinous, of course, has been around since the beginning, popping
