

Tony, believe it or not, last drew an Amoeba Adventures story more than 30 (gasp) years ago back in *Amoeba Adventures* #12 in 1993! It also features the return of my over-the-top vigilante character The Period, who parodied the excesses of 1990s comics and last appeared way back in *Amoeba Adventures* #19!

original Amoeba run which I think come together to make one overall story and return some long, long out of print comics to the world after far too many years.

It's now available on Amazon in both affordable paperback and a spiffy hardcover edition, and includes some vintage guest art by comic book legends Sergio Aragones, Stan Sakai and Dave Sim, a cover gallery and a whopping 7500-words of annotations and behind the scenes material including rare art and more! Just search for *The Best Of Amoeba Adventures* and you'll find the paperback for US\$19.99 and the spiffy hardcover for US\$29.99. Check out the stuff that DC and Marvel comics writer Tony Isabella calls "one of the best small press comics of the 1990s"! Even if you have some of the musty old 'zines of the day, you'll want this book - the artwork is bigger than the original digests, showcasing some of the great work by Max Ink back in the day and my own humble scribblings!

But wait, there's more!

I've also dipped my pen into a couple of other small press projects since last time to shout out!

I wrote and drew a page in the ongoing **Sunday Jam** collaborative comic over at Small Press Heroes that's turning out to be one of the best wild rides of its time featuring more than 40 small press artists to date and many more to come. You can read the whole thing online at **smallpressheroes.com**! Coincidentally mine is the last page in the new print edition **Collected Sunday Jam Volume 1** gathering up the first 28 pages of this epic, oddball and sometimes totally insane adventure! You can also order that for a mere \$5 at that same website.

I also contributed a one-page gag comic starring Prometheus to the latest issue of Phoenix Productions' *Strange Times* anthology magazine. This issue's theme is "My Best Joke" and well, I've never been shy about telling a joke, so I'm pleased to take part in a crew of small-press all-stars that includes *Teri S. Wood, Matt Feazell, Alan Groening* and many more. You'll find my strip as a bonus on the very next page this issue, but I heartily encourage you to order a copy of the whole packed zine over on Amazon, where you'll find it by searching *Strange Times #5: My Best Joke!*

I've run out of space for letters this issue but sure would appreciate any comments you have on #33 or #34 to run whenever the next one comes out - this stuff ain't making me rich, but comments, criticism and so forth are worth their weight in gold! I'm hoping to get another issue out before the end of the year, but your feedback will spur me on to write and draw just a wee bit faster!
